



Community-Based Organizations (CBOs) provide critical services to those disproportionately impacted by incidents. They are the food banks, childcare centers, shelters, and houses of worship that make our communities stronger. When CBOs are unable to continue operating, those who rely on them are left vulnerable. CBOs should maintain and improve their abilities to:

- **Prepare for risks** in their communities;
- Develop **emergency plans** for various disaster types; and
- Understand what is necessary to keep their **doors open** during and after a disaster.

PREPARING COMMUNITY-BASED ORGANIZATIONS

The "OPEN" course introduces community leaders to the **10 preparedness actions** and empowers them to take necessary steps to plan and prepare their CBOs for incidents through lecture, group discussion, and activities.

"OPEN" is a new training that provides CBOs tools to prepare for disasters. This class helps community leaders:

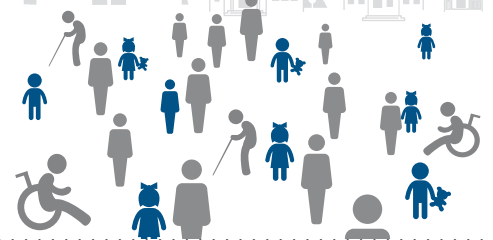
- Identify risks;
